Counter 4/10 Equitably in Duties Article 10 Non Teaching Duties

Teachers will be assigned to supervisory duties based on their non instructional contractual time. Non professional duties shall not exceed 30 total minutes per day beyond a full teaching schedule. K-8 will get a 30 minute duty-free lunch and a 55 consecutive minute prep.

- 1. Supervising recess
- 2. Supervising bus loading/unloading
- 3. Supervising parent pick up and drop off
- 4. Supervising students in the lunch rooms.
- 5. Supervising hallways and bathrooms
- 6. Supervising homeroom at the grammar school.
